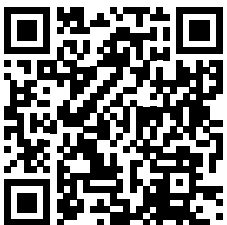

Is There Such a Thing as the Perfect Length of Toe?

For many years, balance of base proportions around the center of rotation of the distal interphalangeal joint has been suggested as optimal for biomechanics. Still, this hasn't been quantified. Does this suggestion stand up to scrutiny? Can we use a deeper understanding of ground reaction forces to present an optimum toe length that can be objectively measured?

Brighton, England, farrier **Yogi Sharp** — The Equine Documentalist — answers these questions with visuals on the effects of toe length, how they affect the tendons and ligaments and the foot interaction with soft surfaces, and, for the first time, gives an objective outcome for interventions regarding toe length.

Hoof Wound Healing: Differences & Similarities with Skin Wounds

It's no secret that farriery is a dangerous profession. Yet, when confronted with the numbers, the reality hits hard.

Like many farriers, **Mark Aikens** is no stranger to work-related injuries. The Norwich, England, shoer pulls back the curtain on an illuminating survey about injuries conducted by the British Farriers and Blacksmiths Association.

Hoof-Care Classroom #5 State-of-the-Art Treatment of Keratoma

Equine keratoma is a benign but locally destructive keratin-producing mass arising from the horse's hoof wall (or, more rarely, solar corium), often resulting in chronic or intermittent lameness due to progressive compression of the distal phalanx with or without concurrent infection.

While lateromedial and dorsopalmar radiographs can demonstrate focal osteolysis or pressure remodeling of the distal phalanx, computed tomography and magnetic resonance imaging are now considered the gold standard for precise localization and determination of lesion extent. **Maarten Oosterlinck**, a University of Ghent specialist veterinarian and 2027 International Equine Veterinarian Hall of Fame inductee, provides an overview of state-of-the-art treatment consisting of minimally invasive, yet complete surgical excision of the keratoma via partial hoof wall resection (or a sole approach, depending on lesion location).

Hoof-Care Classroom #6 Strategies for Evaluating Horses to Maximize Hoof Care

When Marshville, N.C., farrier **Mike Stine** first began learning to trim and shoe, most of the focus was on the hoof, and very little about the rest of the horse. After meeting the late Tony Gonzales, author of *Proper Balance Movement: A Diary of Lameness*, that perspective began to change.

Although we have many modern tools for measuring equine movement and for studying the hoof, when we are in the field, we often have to rely on our observational and practical skills. These evaluation skills translate that into the work we do to help the horse remain sound or regain soundness, and perform to their maximum potential.

Hall of Fame farrier **Nigel Fennell** shares a groundbreaking study tracking hoof angle changes in 36 Thoroughbred racehorses during 90 days of training.

The Harrodsburg, Ky, shoer presents the findings of an in vitro study comparing barefoot, conventionally shod, frog-support and polyurethane-filled shoeing configurations to improve understanding of how these treatments influence caudal hoof movement under controlled loading conditions. This study earned the Farnam, England, native a Fellowship with honors from the Worshipful Company of Farriers.

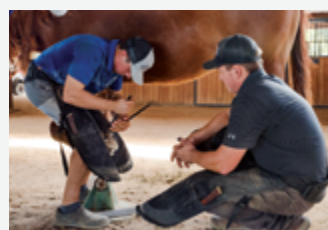
